## TATTOO COVER UP

A few key points about your tattoo cover application. Although I will do my absolute best to completely cover your tattoo and make it appear unnoticeable, there are some important details I would like to make you aware of. Please read each item carefully and notate your acknowledgement by signing below.

- The first step is having reasonable expectations. The texture of the skin at the tattoo area has changed and will appear raised. I cannot reverse this and it is possible that it may still be detectable to anyone who is already familiar with your tattoo. No matter how well I conceal the tattoo, it may never appear as if you didn't get tattooed.
- Once covered, your tattoo should definitely appear undetectable in photos and remain camouflaged to those not looking for it. I use a combination of products and colors to cover the area yet keep it natural and still looking like skin. Unless specifically pointed out, your tattoo should appear concealed and inconspicuous.
- I use quality, professional cosmetics designed for special effects and underwater makeup. These products are intended to withstand water, heat, sweat, tears and rain. They are usually not easily removable and are designed to be cleaned with rubbing alcohol. However, it should be apparent that this is makeup and therefore is not permanent. If it were permanent, I would be a tattoo artist and not a makeup artist.
- The finished cover up is sealed with a waterproof sealer to aid in preventing the cosmetics from rubbing or smearing off. Again, please keep in mind this is still makeup and not permanent so product transfer, however slight may still be possible.
- Allocate a suitable amount of time for the application process. It is lengthy and may take an hour or more depending upon the size and coloring of the tattoo. Allowing for proper application time will alleviate any anxiety over the process.
- The tiny hairs, usually not visible on the skin, will become more pronounced with the airbrush makeup therefore, I will usually shave the area prior to any makeup application. It should be understood that some hairs may still be evident.
- I suggest avoiding any sort of body lotion to the area to be covered as it may negatively affect the stability of the tattoo cover and its application. Underlying cosmetic products can create a slippery surface and cause the tattoo cover to not adhere properly to the skin.
- Be advised that the consumption of alcohol in the days preceding the event may have an adverse effect on the lasting ability of the cover up. Your body releases alcohol through the skin which reacts with the products used and may cause the makeup to disappear sooner than anticipated. Excessive consumption of alcohol should be avoided if at all possible or at least limited, as it may also cause issues with your beauty makeup as well.
