The Cinnamon Hill House was built in 1895 by C.E. Corley and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The home's unique features reflect the American Queen Anne style popular during the 1870's. Spacious rooms with original wide plank pine floors, blown glass windows and simple fireplace mantels are part of its vintage charm. The home was restored in 1972 by the Marchant family where they raised their 2 sons. In the late 80's the home was turned into a gift shop that offered china, unique gifts and served their signature Southern Pecan Coffee in a pedestal style coffee cup. In the 90's the home was converted into a fine dining restaurant managed by the Marchant Sons and is still today remembered as the place that locals loved to come to celebrate special occasions. The Miller family purchased the home in 2007 and turned the home into a high-end gift shop that offered Studio 56 porcelain Christmas houses, fine gifts and a tasty lunch menu. Once again the home was sold in 2014 to the LaRocque family and became a Mother and Son establishment that sold upcycled furniture and items made by local artisans. After hosting the wedding for one of the sons in March 2017 the LaRocque's decided the home was best suited as a venue to celebrate special occasions.
